Missionary of the Month:

Greetings from Poland

About a month ago we started having in-person church services again but once again because of country wide restrictions we had to make a move to limit the number of people in the room that we meet in. We had been splitting into home groups.

In Lubin our language center is active on-line as well as in person. We continue on with construction. The building is coming together – Our kitchen is almost finished and at the moment we are working on getting up to fire code.

In Legnica (where the Lubin church is now planting a new fellowship) I continue to be active in our small group, prayer time three times a week (I attend one of those times) and have some English classes / conversation. We meet as a small group on Sundays. Most of the missionaries that were serving with us in Legnica are stuck in their home countries at the moment so I am kind of waiting for more of our team members to return in order to pursue an idea that I have of opening up a family center. But I don't want to get too far ahead of everyone.

So, in general things are positive but of course we are having to do things in different ways – which by the way is not a bad thing. In April we were planning our XIII Lubin Gospel Workshop. This is an annual event that has been done for the last 12 years except last year. We want the theme to be "hope". I hope that people are encouraged and God becomes more real in people's lives. Most participants are not believers. We are praying that God would use this to help people see their need for a Savior.

The boys, Andrew and Aaron are in New York working at the moment. Alaina is with us – We are working on her paperwork for a residency card and or citizenship. It has already been about 3 years since we turned in the paperwork. She graduated last year but now can't do anything because she does not have a residency card and or citizenship. She has been helping us in our Language Center and cleaning a little in Legnica.

Please send our greetings to everyone and our thanks for prayers and support over the years. Please continue to pray that God would lead people to Himself. We also would like prayer as we evaluate the various ministries / events that have been done over the years and how we would like to proceed in both Lubin and Legnica. We don't want to become just satisfied with having services on Sunday. Blessings, Paul

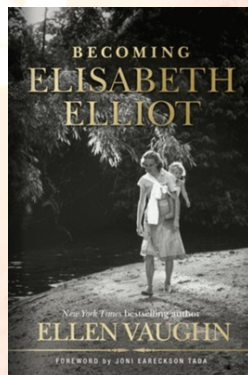

Book Review

BECOMING ELISABETH ELLIOT By Ellen Vaughn

Jim and Elisabeth Elliot were missionaries in Ecuador where they believed the Lord wanted them to reach the savage Waodani tribe with the Gospel. Jim and four fellow missionaries were speared to death as they attempted to communicate with the Waodani. Rather than leave Ecuador in fear and despair, Elisabeth remained with her young daughter and actually lived with the very tribe responsible for her husband's death. Upon leaving Ecuador later, she went on to write dozens of books, traveled around the world speaking, and hosted a radio program.

What kind of childhood, education, and experiences prepared Elisabeth for such a lengthy and intense ministry? What soul-searching guided her along the path of life-long service? Author Ellen Vaughn used Elisabeth's personal journals, letters, and speeches along with interviews with family and friends to give a broad portrait of a woman totally committed to obeying Jesus Christ – no matter the cost. Vaughn shares not only Elisabeth's joy and triumphs, but her times of failure and struggle.

I urge everyone to read this book about one of the most significant Christian figures in our generation. It will touch your heart and challenge your faith!
