Title: "Dead to Sin; Alive in Christ!"

Text: Romans 6:1-14

INTRODUCTION:

- 1. Our Lord instituted two ordinances: the Lord's Supper & Baptism; ordinances that His disciples were to observe regularly.
- 2. What was prescribed by our Lord in the Great Commission (Matt. 28:18-20) was practiced by the apostles as they shared the gospel message and people were saved by trusting Christ alone as Savior.
 - NT never envisions the abnormal situation of an unbaptized believer!
 - NT times baptism closely followed conversion; the two were considered part of one event (cp. Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38).

THE CONTEXT (5:12-6:1)

Does salvation by grace and through faith encourage sinful living by giving us a license to sin? See 5:20. NO! God's grace not only forgives sins, but also delivers us from sinning. Grace does more than justify; it also sanctifies!

THE	TRUTH (6:2-10)
"We died to sin [in the past];	how can we live in it any longer [in the future]?"
Its not the literal impossibilit	ry of sin in believers which Paul is declaring, but
the moral absurdity (inapprop	riateness) of it.

- What does "we died to sin" mean?
 In Christ, the score has been settled, the debt paid, the law satisfied, & our old life (what we were in Adam) has ended. I'm a child of God; I'm part of God's new creation. As such, I should want nothing more to do with sin!
- When did we "die to sin"?
 Union with Christ is secured by personal faith in Christ's finished work and signified by means of water baptism by immersion.
