- according to the foreknowledge of <u>God the Father</u>, = the Father's electing love (Eph. 1:4)
- through the sanctifying work of <u>the Spirit</u>,
 the work of the Spirit in convicting the sinner and bringing him or her to faith in Christ. See 2 Thess. 2:13-14.
- for obedience to <u>Jesus Christ</u> and sprinkling by <u>His blood</u>.
 = the substitutionary death of Jesus, the Lamb of God.

In the mind of God there is an assured goal (cp. Romans 8:28-30).
