
THE DAY OF THE LORD IN THE OLD AND NEW TESTAMENTS

The "day of the LORD" or the often equivalent terms, "that day" or "the great day" occurs more than seventy-five times in the word of God. Eschatologically, it is the time/the day of God's intervention in the affairs of men. There is a day of reckoning coming: a day when the nations of the world will answer for their sin and blasphemy. Most references are found in the OT, but there are some in the NT. See 1 Thess. 5:2-3; 2 Thess. 2:2; 2 Pet. 3:10.
