	A. "They have taken the way of Cain" (or, "traveled on the road of Cain"). Cain rebelled against God's way of (Gen. 4; 1 John 3:11-12).				
	B. "They have <i>rushed for profit into</i> (or, <i>gave themselves over to</i>) Balaam's error." The "way of Balaam" is merchandising one's gifts & ministry just for the purpose of making money. The false teachers were greedy for material gain and, like Balaam, would do anything for money.				
	C. "They <i>have been destroyed</i> (or, <i>perished</i>) in Korah's rebellion (see Numbers 16). Korah & his followers resented the leadership of Moses and dared God to do nothing about their rebellion. In speaking against Moses, they were speaking against the Lord.

	C. What does Enoch's prophecy say about the coming judgment?				
	1) It will be a judgment: God Himself will come to judge the world.
