McCoy Memorial Baptist Church August 20, 2023 Spring/Summer Series: The Minor Prophets Text: Zechariah: "Yahweh has remembered" (ze·kar·yah; קרָרָה)

This theme dominates the whole book: Israel will be blessed because Yahweh remembers the covenants He made with their forefathers (Abraham & David).

## INTRODUCTION:

- "<u>Oracle</u> (= <u>burden</u>)" refers to something heavy, a load to be lifted and bear. In context (chs. 12-14), the "oracle" is a weighty message from the LORD concerning 1) a yet future siege against Jerusalem and 2) the eventual salvation of Israel.
- 2. The setting for the fulfillment of these prophecies is "on that day", a phrase used 16 times in the last three chapters. It refers to the Day of the LORD, a time of God's wrath and blessing that extends from the beginning of the future seven-year Tribulation to the end of the Millennial Kingdom.

## THE \_\_\_\_\_ OF ISRAEL (12:1-14)

- The \_\_\_\_\_\_ of Jerusalem (vss. 1-4) Any nation that invades Jerusalem during the Day of the LORD will suffer severe judgment.

ISRAEL'S \_\_\_\_\_ REMOVED (13:1-9)

- 1. Israel's \_\_\_\_\_ (vs. 1) The fountain of cleansing is the shed blood of the pierced Messiah (12:10)
- cut off (vss. 2-6)
  God will remove all idols & false prophets from the land. Parents will participate in the eradication of all false prophets (including family members).
- 3. Afflictions of \_\_\_\_\_ (vss. 7-9)
  - A. The Shepherd is the Messiah (11:4-17; 12:10).
  - B. The Sword Man's wrath or God's wrath?

C. The Sheep that reject the Shepherd suffered (A.D. 70 & 135). Since, Jewish people were scattered across the earth in what is commonly called the Diaspora. They have suffered 2,000 of persecution & are yet to face the greatest holocaust of their history during the Great Tribulation (Jer. 30:7; Rev. 12:1-17).

## THE MESSIAH'S GLORIOUS \_\_\_\_\_\_(14:1-7)

Zechariah closed his prophetic predictions with a sweeping overview of Israel's future. The prophet described <u>five major events</u> that will take place:

- 1. The Massive \_\_\_\_\_ (vss. 1, 2)
  - A. Near the midpoint of the seven years, a huge army from the north, south, and east will try to capture and plunder Israel. It will be led by a leader called Gog from the land of Magog (Ezekiel 38-39).
  - B. The Tribulation closes with another attack on Israel. This invation is commonly known as Armageddon (Joel 3:9-16; Rev. 16:14, 16; 19:11-19) and "the battle of the great day of God Almighty" (Rev. 16:14). See Daniel 11:40-44.
- 2. The Messiah's \_\_\_\_\_ (vss. 3, 12-15)
- The Messiah's \_\_\_\_\_\_ (vss. 4-10) When the Messiah intervenes militarily on Israel's behalf, His feet will touch the Mount of Olives (see Acts 1:9-12). Note that these verses emphasize the physical, personal, public, literal, & visible return of the Messiah to earth in His glorified body.
- 4. \_\_\_\_\_ Glorious \_\_\_\_\_ (vss. 8-15)
- 5. \_\_\_\_\_ in the Kingdom (vss. 16-21)
